HEALTH SERVICES

Harold Sherman Adult Day Care: provides care to elderly, mentally impaired and disabled individuals and enables them to remain in their homes as long as possible, while providing their caregiver(s) with the much needed and deserved break from providing care. 919-690-3273

ELDERLY SERVICES

Granville Nutrition Program: provides a nutrition site in the Stovall area that serves both congregate site and home delivered meals at lunch to individuals over 60 years old. This program includes nutrition education and support services to seniors. 919-693-1930

Senior Services Lifeline: provides installation and payment of monthly fees for a safety device that allows low-income senior adults to get prompt attention in case of an emergency. 919-693-1930

CRISIS NEEDS: FOOD, CLOTHING, SHELTER

American Red Cross: provides volunteer blood services, conducts health and safety training, offers emergency disaster services, youth and community volunteer services. 919-693-6550

Area Congregations in Ministry: provides emergency help to individuals and families facing a one-time crisis. Assistance available for basic needs, i.e. fuel, food, clothing. 919-690-0961 (open Mon-Wed-Fri • 9 am-12 noon)

Lifeline Outreach: provides a safe shelter for homeless and abused women and children. 252-438-2098
